The CSU Nonresident Tuition Exemption is open to CSU students enrolled as undergraduate or graduate students who

MUST MEET THE EXEMPTION REQUIREMENTS

Attendance requirement (must meet one)

*A year's equivalence at a California community college is either a minimum of 24 semester units of credit or 36 quarter units. Full-time attendance at a California adult school is a minimum of 420 hours of attendance for each school year.

DEADLINES

Students must submit their application for nonresident tuition exemption by the deadline for the semester in which they wish to be exempt. Applications for the fall semester must be submitted by August 15, and applications for the spring semester must be submitted by February 15. Applications received after these deadlines will be considered for the following semester.
