<p>GPA gives you more options.</p> <p><b>What classes do I need to complete for CSU transfer?</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Complete the "Golden Four" &gt; CSU GE Areas A1, A2, A3 and B4.</li> <li>• Early on, enroll in courses required for your major.</li> <li>• Some major requirements may also satisfy general education requirements (ie. double-count).</li> <li>• Whenever possible, choose CSU GE classes of interest.</li> </ul> <p><b>How do I find the courses required for my major?</b> Go to ASSIST (<a href="http://www.assist.org">www.assist.org</a>). If applicable, complete an Associate Degree for Transfer (ADT) at Chabot College. For ADT degrees, see the Chabot College Catalog and/or DegreeWorks.</p>		<p><b>MAJOR COURSEWORK</b></p>
<p><b>What else should I know about CSU GE?</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Each year the CSU GE pattern is updated, so select courses from the current year's agreement.</li> <li>• Courses that appear in multiple areas may only be counted in one area, except the US History and American Institutions courses, which may also be used for Area D .</li> </ul> <p><b>How can I get more help with transfer?</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Make an appointment with a Chabot College Counselor to develop a Student Educational Plan (SEP) to clarify your goals and to map your course requirements.</li> <li>• Join a Chabot College First Year Experience (FYE), Special Program, and/or take a Psychology-Counseling (PSCN) course to enhance college success.</li> <li>• Meet with transfer reps &amp; attend workshops in the Transfer Center. Attend Chabot College Transfer Day.</li> <li>• Visit/tour transfer schools.</li> </ul> <p><b>What is CSU GE certification?</b> A process in which Chabot College verifies that your CSU GE is completed. After you have accepted an offer of admission to a CSU campus, you must submit a petition to the Chabot Admissions Office requesting CSU GE certification. If CSU GE isn't completed prior to transfer, partial certification of CSU GE is also available. CSU certification is automatic for students who apply for, and earn, AA-T or AS-T degrees.</p>
